More on Bubbles

What can you blow bubbles through?



Scissor handles
 Rings off plastic milk containers (hold with peg)
 A disposable drinking cup (poke a small hole in the bottom — dip big end in mixture and blow through hole)
 Cardboard tubes
 Drinking straws
 Cotton reel
 Your hands

Bubble mixture needs 3 days to settle before use. Have a special jar for the bubble mixture...with the recipe taped on the side!
 Remember — make a new batch after a bubble blowing session so it is always available next time.

Bubble blowing is a great way to learn breath control....

Encourage the bubble blowers to dip into mix carefully — best not to have a froth on top of mix.

The best bubbles are blown on a moist overcast day - not a dry sunny one!
